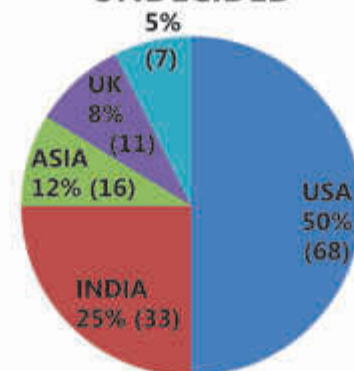

## IGCSE

Students in Grade 9 and 10 pursue the International General Certificate of Secondary Education, which is a broad based and challenging curriculum for 14-16 year olds. The IGCSE syllabus places strong emphasis on application based learning. We require the students to study a minimum of 8 subjects and a maximum of 9. The grading is on an eight-point scale (A\* to G) and grades A to E are equivalent to O Level Grades A to E. In addition to their IGCSE studies, the students are encouraged to undertake career counseling and attend summer courses to explore their interests further.
