Student Admission Policy and Process

Jayshree Periwal International School (JPIS) IB World School, running the International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) and the International Baccalaureate (IB) streams of curriculum, is open to students from all walks of life and from across the world, seeking admissions in Pre-Primary to 12th grade. Furthermore, the school is inclusive to the extent of also admitting students with mild and moderate special education needs. This document provides an overview of JPIS's beliefs and practices regarding the student admission.

Admission Facts:

- Student eligibility shall be determined based on school policies and in accordance with the programme requirements.
- No student, who otherwise qualifies as per the policy, shall be denied admission
 to the school on the basis of colour, race, religion, gender, national or ethnic
 origin, or shall be discriminated by way of treatment, evaluation or any other
 consideration.
- The student will be evaluated on their ability to meet the school's academic standards, successful history of academic performance and appropriate personal conduct. Students must show fluency in English, as the medium of instruction is English, so that it does not impact their studies.
- This is done through an assessment process, which involves written evaluation, face-to-face interview and past reports from the previous school (academic and all other relevant reports depending on the grade and the programme applied for).
- The school admits students who would thrive in the learning environment of the school with their academic and personal needs met by the programmes offered in school.
- The school accepts applications for admissions throughout the school year.
 Lateral admissions during an academic session would be based on the academic and behavioral merits of the student, recommendations carried, reasons for change/transfer and the applicant's assessment on adaptability to the new environment. The Management's decision will be final in such matters.

Students are required to meet the following criteria:

IB- Diploma Programme	11 th and 12 th	Sequential age. Test of English and Mathematics. Alignment of subjects if coming in from other boards.

For Classes 1 and above, JPIS provides both the options: Day Boarding and Term Boarding facilities. The fee structures for each mode of schooling along with facilities provided are detailed in the Fee Structure. Charges for external examinations such as IGCSE (Grade 10th), IB Diploma (Grade 12th) etc. are not included in the Fee structure as they are governed by the respective boards and vary, subject to subject, year on year.

Day School for Classes Nursery to VIII run from 8:00 am to 2:15 pm. For students of Classes 9thto 12ththe timings are 8:00 am to 4:45 pm. All students will have a five-day schooling i.e., Monday to Friday, normally. Boarding school students will be provided Teacher supervised Assistance Sessions on Saturdays, till noon.

JPIS can provide day scholars of Nursery to VIII, extended school hours till 4:45 pm. Additional games and hobby classes and assisted Home Work completion will be provided for such students for an additional Fee.

The New Academic Year for the school begins in April except for DP students where their year begins in July However, DP students may join in April – June quarter as well, with an additional Pre-Term Fee *for Foundation IB*. For such students, therefore, the first year would have 1+4 quarter's fee to be collected.

Special Remedial Classes will be provided to desirous students.

Except for Caution Money all Fees paid will not be refunded once the student is admitted to JPIS.

Decision of the school's selection committee will be final.

Admission Process:

- 1. The parent fills in the Application form, the counsellor explains the principal beliefs of school, gives a brief on the programmes offered, explains the process of admission to the parent.
- 2. School tour is organized for the parent. The parent is introduced to the infrastructure and facilities. Opportunity to meet a teacher and watch a class in progress comes along as per the day's routine.
- 3. The filled in application with relevant details will be submitted to the school as per the specification.
- 4. The applications are scrutinized and the admissions committee will schedule an observation/test for the applicant. The observation/test is conducted by way of play activities, academic activities, written test or/and face-to-face interview as per the requirements age/grade wise.
- 5. The observation/test records are analyzed by the respective grade wise academic team and the school's decision for the candidate's admission is conveyed directly to the parent via an offer letter. The parents are given a timeline to complete the admission formalities and the process moves to next step. In situations of admission denial also, the admissions committee communicates the same to the parents.
- 6. The admission is deemed to be complete on the payment of admission fee and submission of relevant documents to the school admissions office. With that the family becomes a part of JPIS family.

The Admission stage for applicants for Nursery, KG and Prep is initiated by the discussions with the child in the presence of the parents, by Designated Assessment Teachers (DAT). In case an assigned DAT happens to know the applicant or the parents in any way, s/he should declare the same and have the assessment responsibility changed to another DAT. Final decision for admission would be taken by the Head of Admission Committee.

For admissions to Classes 1 to 9, all applicants have to take a diagnostic written test in English and Mathematics. The level of questions in the test would be appropriate to the applicant's last examination passed. Answer sheets would be evaluated by DAT. The final decision would be taken after a face-to-face discussion of the applicant with the Admission committee. Meritorious students are awarded merit scholarships.

Admission Process for DP

Existing JPIS Students

All students of the school graduating from grade 10 and opting for IBDP are enrolled automatically in Year 1 of the Diploma Programme (Grade 11). To help in subject selection the DPC and the DP Pedagogical Team organizes a DP orientation session with the parents and students. At the end of the session there are individual sessions with the DPC and the pedagogical team and the college counsellor. The subject selection is done on the basis of student performance, interest and career and College preferences. The parents, students, DPC supported by the DP pedagogical team along with the College counsellors participate in the session collaboratively.

Students new to JPIS

For all students desirous of taking admission in DP program at JPIS

- A placement assessment based on skills in Mathematics and English is undertaken. The assessment helps in judging the placement of the student at an appropriate level in math and language.
- An initial interview with DDPC is conducted wherein parent and student queries
 regarding the Diploma program and subject choices offered are answered. The
 interaction also helps in selection of and placement at an appropriate level in
 language B.
- 3. A review of the student achievement for the last two years is conducted by the DPC.
- 4. Based on steps 1-3, the decision to grant admission to the school is taken.
- Once the student has been granted admission, the College counsellor meets with the student and parents to understand the career choices and offer advice on subject selection.
- 6. A final formal interaction of the student and parents with the DPC or HOS (in

the absence of DPC) is conducted. The subject choices are finalized in consultation with the DPC.

Students from other schools are allowed to join the DP program till the end of year 1. The school also accepts students from other IB schools upto the beginning of year 2, provided that the students were pursuing the subjects JPIS offers. These students follow the same process (outlined above) as that undertaken for new students. The students are expected to submit official records of CAS, IA work and transcripts from the previous school. The decision to take the students mid-year in DP depends on the DPC and her decision is final.

Orientation of new students

All students and parents new to IGCSE / IBDP at JPIS have an orientation session with the IGCSEC / DPC, at the beginning of the academic session, wherein the details of the IGCSE Programme and IB Diploma Programme and future prospects are discussed with the parents and students. The rules and regulations of the School are shared with the parents and students. The parents are informed in advance of the orientation dates via email and text messages.

Admission Policy for students with inclusive education needs:

JPIS aims to make education **accessible** to all students to provide **equal opportunities of learning**. In its effort to have a **least restrictive environment**, parents are expected to provide all the assessment reports, psycho-educational testing report, and other appropriate supporting documents to best address the needs of students to be engaged in learning.

Service provided:

- 1. The school provides environmental accommodations to physically challenged students and makes reasonable adjustments for their appropriate mobility around the campus to gain access to the full curriculum.
- Classroom support, individual remediation, reinforcement of concepts and existing curriculum differentiation is also available for mainstream inclusion of students with needs.

Admission Criteria:

A current formal psycho-educational assessment report (signed by a clinical psychologist) is required for every new admission to request for examination considerations

The range of severity of disability of students admissible will be placed between borderline to mild disability criteria.

Post admission, the school facilitates for the smooth transition of the student and the family. Parent Orientation Programs are planned to enable the student and family to be inducted into the school system.

Admission shall be provisional till all documents are submitted at school office and are found in order.

For each admitted applicant, the following list of testimonials needs to be collected, within 15 days of admission:

- 1. Birth certificate
- 2. Passport copies of the applicant and parents (for hostel)
- 3. Past year mark sheet to be submitted. E.g. If seeking admission to Grade 5 then mark sheet has to be submitted for Grade 4
- 4. Co-curricular certificates (if any)
- 5. Reference letter from current school.
- 6. School Leaving certificate (after receiving from current school)
- 7. Passport size photographs of applicant & one each of the parents.

The student / parent shall be liable for any wrong information leading to cancellation of admission. All fee / dues paid shall be forfeited.

Inquiries about the school, the curricula, pedagogy are also addressed telephonically, online or face-to-face throughout the year. JPIS being the pioneer world school with IB and IGCSE curricula in Jaipur, it needs to ensure that inquiries are handled with utmost maturity and painstaking caution. Only well informed Senior Teachers, who are patient listeners, articulate speakers and well prepared on the FAQs handle this.

The above Admission Kit (available at all the Jayshree Periwal group schools) may either be requested for, over the counter on cash payment or ordered online. Online requesters would get the kit couriered across. Domestic and Overseas courier charges would be applicable.

The school's fees can be paid in two installments, as per Annexure 1a & b. The part of the fee that needs to be paid at the time of admission must be done within 7 days of selection test results to ensure that the seat is booked. Payments arriving after expiry of due date will attract a Late Fee. Transport request form also needs to be

collected along with the aforesaid first payment, so as to have enough time to work out logistics, more so in cases of a currently un-serviced new route.

The Post-admission process starts with allocation of sections to the new students. Day scholars (8:00 am to 2:15 pm) would usually be Sections different from the full Day Boarding and Boarding School students. Lists of new students to be provided to the respective Class Teachers with necessary demographic details of the new students and their subject choices, to be able to welcome and receive them on the prescribed date of reporting (DOR).

JPIS will provide necessary logistics support from the nearest airport, metro, railway and roadway terminals for new admits to be picked-up along with their baggage, on the prescribed DOR. Requests for pick-up and similar support on any other date, than the prescribed DOR, would be chargeable.

All pending payments towards Quarterly Fee, Caution Money etc. and testimonials of the new student need to be collected on the DOR. A deficiency declaration form duly signed by the Parent or Guardian and the student (Annexure – 12) stating the deficiencies in documents, testimonials or Fee, needs to be taken from the Parents/Guardians along with an outer limit of 30 days by when the same would be submitted to the school. Failing to comply, the parents accept that JPIS would have the right to cancel the admission of their ward/child, forthwith, refunding only the caution money (if that has been paid).

Post the reporting activities and allotment of transport arrangements for the Day Scholars and Day Boarders, the respective Class Teachers would introduce the new student to the class, vibrantly, facilitating the comfort and rapport building of the new fish with the existing school.

For the constant care and well-being of the Boarding School students, JPIS provides for Hostel Parents (HP). Each floor of the Hostels at JPIS (boys and girls) has an experienced and qualified HP who would stay in the furnished residence on the floor for which he/she is an HP. All new boarding students would be assigned their HPs for ensuring that each child has an immediate anchor and support for growing their roots. The HPs would not only provide crucial support for the new comer (students) but also ensure that necessary parental watch is kept on the children who are still in their formative years.

Class Teachers and respective Coordinators of JPIS take periodic feedbacks from the boarding scholars about their well-being. For speedy redressal the escalation matrix

for any matters of grievance is through the Hostel Parents to the Head of Hostel Parents to the Director of JPIS.

Minor deviations w.r.t. the process above may be authorized by the Principal of JPIS. All other deviations in Process or Policy parameters must be authorized by the Governing Members or Director of JPIS.

Withdrawal Policy:

All withdrawals from the school can be made only on a written request to the School Administration by the parents/guardian of the child. The application has to be made one month prior to the withdrawal of admission for any grade or else fees for the next quarter/academic year will be charged. It should state the reason for the student leaving the school and the date of leaving.

Those who leave in May must in all cases pay the fees till the month of June.

Transfer Certificate will be issued only when the above conditions are fulfilled and after depositing charges for processing. Processing time for issue of TC is 15 days.

Consistent failure of payment of fees before the due date will result in the student's name being struck off the rolls.

Process of Review-

- The Admission Policy is reviewed annually and collectively by the Steering committee. However, it can be reviewed in the wake of an unforeseen development, or change in IB Policies.
- The review process considers the current or emerging issues that have been faced since the last period of review. All the desired and approved changes are then incorporated through consensus in the policy.
- A collaborative and interactive discussion among all staff and representatives
 of other stakeholders will help the school in getting feedback on the
 implementation of the policy in all spheres of the school. Feedback from
 students, parents, and teachers will help the steering committee to make
 appropriate changes.
- Any new procedures, measures or technical requirements are introduced/ included.

The International General Certificate of Secondary Education (Grade 9, 10)

The International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) is the world's most popular international qualification for 14- to 16-year-olds. It develops successful students, giving them excellent preparation for their next steps in education, and equips them with invaluable skills for future life. The challenging course enables students to learn more than facts. It encourages students to ask challenging questions and to develop intercultural understanding while maintaining a strong sense of their own identity and culture. Furthermore, the grade 10 board examination, eliminates the need for students to take exams such as TOEFL or IELTS, and prepares them for an easier transition into colleges and universities.

The IGCSE programmes are recognized around the world and in India. The curriculum, pedagogy and activities focus on international perspectives making students global citizens in the true sense of the word. The curriculum contains five groups from which the students may choose as per their inclinations and talents. At the end of the programme students are assessed by the school as well as the IGCSE examiners.

International Baccalaureate Organization's Diploma Programme (Grade 11, 12)

Some frequently asked questions:

What are the benefits of the IB Diploma Programme when compared with other curricula?

Most importantly, perhaps, the IB Diploma fosters the spirit of learning through questioning and discovery—the finding out of the 'why', not just the learning of the 'what'; not just learning content but grasping concepts. Its balanced combination of Arts and Science subjects avoids premature specialization, while its international perspective encourages students to learn about their own culture and those of others. Universities and employers thus know that the successful IB Diploma student is intelligent, well organized, hard-working, internationally aware and capable of the critical and creative thinking that tomorrow's world demands. Students are better prepared for college in India or abroad. The children are also exempted from TOEFL. Extra weightage in given for medical exam. The students also get better prepared for SAT and/or ACT while doing the IBDP (11th & 12th)

Do I have to be a brilliant all-rounder to undertake the IB Diploma Programme?

No, although it helps! The IB Diploma is accessible to a wide range of students. It requires a willingness to persevere with a range of subjects, but this gives the breadth of education that universities appreciate. It is important to select your best subjects for Higher Level: these should be chosen on the basis of what you are good at, what you enjoy most and what you may need for your future career, e.g., Mathematics and Physics are essential for aspiring engineers. Your Standard Level subjects may also be those that you enjoy and in which you are succeeding, but may be the ones in which you are less confident—we are not all brilliant mathematicians or linguists!

Is IB very simple?

IB seems very simple as there is no rote-learning required. It is based on understanding and hence application becomes easy though it is the most challenging curriculum in the world and in rated the topmost even by Harvard and Stanford.

Is the examination pattern very complex?

It is wholesome and continuous assessment of the child rather than one single exam. It includes internals, projects, portfolios, commentaries, essays, and even participation in community service is part of the programme.

Is the IBO recognized in India?

Yes, The Association of Indian Universities (AIU) recognizes the IB Diploma as equivalent to the Plus Two (10 + 2) Class of the Senior Secondary School, e.g. CBSE, ICSE, which is the eligibility criteria for admission to the undergraduate courses in universities in India. The **AIU** has announced a formula to convert the IB grades (1 to 7) into percentage. Now the Indian colleges also recognize and accept DP course provided students have taken exams in 6 subjects.

What are the prospects of IB Diploma graduates getting admission to Indian universities?

Requirements for professional course admission:

Medical courses: Higher Level passes in Physics, Chemistry and Biology with Standard Level passes in English. The medical degree courses include MBBS, BDS, B. Pharm., Nursing and BPT.

Engineering courses: Higher Level passes in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics with Standard Level passes in English. Engineering courses include B. Eng. in all streams - civil, mechanical, electrical, electronics, instrumentation, computer, aeronautical engineering and so on.

To cater to student applying in Indian colleges, the IBO has decided to issue percentage equivalency and a transcript of results in addition of the existing graded results. It is sensitive to the needs of the Indian market and is constantly changing and adapting to the Indian requirements.

The above information is upheld by the fact that JPIS DP students are studying at leading colleges like St. Xavier's, HR, Jai Hind, and others in Mumbai, Symbiosis in Pune, Christ College in Bangalore and Lady Shri Ram College, St. Stephens and Ashoka in Delhi amongst others.

Will an IB Diploma student be able to appear for the entrance examinations for admission to professional courses like engineering, medicine, management, law, etc. in India and with what chance of success?

The students will not only be able to appear for exams like CET, PMT, IIT, BMS, BMCCC, CPT, CLAT but will also find themselves better equipped due to the in depth and self-study undertaken during the IB Diploma Programme. The student must however be familiar with required subject combinations, and levels that would ensure student eligibility for particular professional course

What about admission in regular colleges in India?

IB students have obtained admissions in leading colleges like **St. Xaviers College**, **HR College**, **Jai Hind College**, **Government Law College and others in Mumbai**, **Symbiosis in Pune**, **and Lady Shri Ram College & St. Stephens in Delhi**. This list is endless. In most Indian universities admissions are over by mid-June, however, the IB Diploma results are declared only on July 6. While overseas universities grant admission on the basis of predicted grades, most Indian universities require the final mark sheets issued by the Board. On our part, the school writes to colleges to which students seek admission, details like student's predicted grade, evidence of AIU recognition and the IB results timelines. To enhance the chances of admission, it is advisable that students and parents initiate the application process and follow-up efforts early enough with the prospective colleges.

Do IB Diploma graduates earn transfer credits at overseas universities?

Yes. Considering the rigor and credibility of the IB Diploma Programme, universities in the US generally award transfer credits to IB Diploma graduates. Students who have scored high grades (say grade 5 or above) in Higher Level IB courses stand a good chance of earning such university credits. However, such credits would vary from university to university. These credits could translate into saving upto a year during the undergraduate degree.

What are the benefits of the IB Diploma Programme when compared with other curricula?

It encourages children to be life-long learners and critical thinkers. It opens more avenues for students in India and abroad. It is application-based learning which leads to belter success in life.
